Projects in Hand.

- The appointment of a lengthsman has been agreed, funding obtained and the job advertised. A lengthsman deals with weeds on the road edges and the grass verges, clears litter, undergrowth, and the roadside drains and culverts; and maintains picnic sites.
- In response to a traffic census through Mordiford village, and following consultation with Hereford Council, the School Governors, and the parishioners measures are being considered which will calm the traffic past the school and improve the safety for our children attending the school: for example, a 20 mph speed limit and double yellow lines, a flashing 'Slow Down' sign. (These would be subject to funding availability).
- The possibility of improvements to the bus services are being researched in conjunction with Fownhope Parish.
- The Neighbourhood Watch Scheme is operating in 5 areas. Police bulletins are distributed.
- The police are invited to attend P C meetings and report to the meeting.
- A 'Housing Need' survey is being distributed with this Newsletter. Please spare a few minutes to help us address this important topic. Thank you.
- An exciting project to restore the 'Iron Room' has been initiated by the Parish Council under the guidance of Councillor Cheryl Shearer in response to a request from some enterprising youths of the Parish for a Youth Club. They have been active in clearing the site, and raising funds. The Parish Council has now applied for funding, and it is hoped that a Youth Club open to all 12 years+ in the Parish will soon be available.
