**Footpaths.** Amey has taken over as Herefordshire Council's new contractors for Highways and Rights of Way issues. The re-painting of zig-zags at the School, Larport Lane Crossroads, and Chapel Lane Priors Frome has been completed. Please note a change Amey has made on the Mordiford Loop Walk. A bridge has been removed and the footpath diverted to less marshy ground. Follow the way markings. The P.C. Footpaths Officer is organising the replacement of stiles with self-closing gates. At present 5 are in the course of being replaced with more to follow. More work has been done on the Checkley Barn site, a seat is planned for the area.

**Neighbourhood Watch** is in operation in 5 areas, Mordiford village, Pentaloe Close area, Sufton Rise, Checkley and Dormington. The co-ordinatators deliver the Police bulletins and serve as a link between residents and the Police in cases of need or anxiety.

**Recycling** The new wheelie bins for all your recycling have been delivered. The collection day is Friday every other week starting on November.13th. If you require a smaller wheelie bin or help to get the bin to the kerb please ring 01432 260051. asap.

Welsh Water workmen for Lewis have been making steady progress in renewing water pipes on the Woolhope Road and in Pentaloe Close. They have been very obliging and considerate in keeping disruption to a minimum. The pressure in the taps has improved. The supply to the "Spout" was inadvertently cut off; attempts are being made to restore the supply. Work has also been done on the mill-race serving Mordiford Mill. Lewis broke the large pipe running under the road near Pentaloe mini-green and corrective action was immediately taken by Mr. Taggett who has been renovating the mill. He has also been dealing with the many leaks which occur along the mill race between the Pentaloe River and the mill and spill onto the road.

**Emergency Co-ordinator.** Councillor P. Davies has been appointed Emergency Co-ordinator for the local Parishes. He will provide sandbags as protection against flooding, and be the link, through the Emergency Services, to relay advance warning of any emergency that threatens the area.
