	a) Core Strategy It was felt that the new Hereford relief road should go to the East, linking Rotherwas to the B4224, coming out at the bottom of Tupsley Pitch, on the Ledbury road at a minimum. This would relieve the pressure on the already-busy Mordiford – Dormington road. An Eastern route would not only benefit Rotherwas but would link the south side of the city with the colleges and the hospital, making access easier, particularly for ambulances. Concern was expressed that no mention was made of health services which would be essential to support the proposed growth. Resolved: To respond with a recommendation that the opportunity for an Eastern route should be given serious consideration as should the provision of additional health services.	Clerk
