	No police representative was present and there was no update.

	Cllr Hardwick gave a brief update on the Core Strategy which was out for consultation over one issue	
	(links with Government directive on Wind Farms), saying that it was anticipated that the Core	
	Strategy would be adopted by September. Cllr Hardwick then gave an update on Herefordshire	
	Council's budget position, saying that during 2010/11 £49 million savings had been made with	
	another £42 million needing to be made over the next 5 years, meaning that subsidies to Parish	
	Councils would be reduced significantly or become non-existent. 60% of the Council budget was	
	spent on 2% of the population, notably Health and Social Care. A consultation questionnaire was	
	currently on the Herefordshire Council website and Cllr Hardwick encouraged members of the public	
	to make their views known. Cllr Hardwick finished by saying that Shepherd's Orchard, which was officially opened on 14 th July, was a great credit to the Parish Council and to the local community.

	There was no further update and it was agreed not to include this as a standing item on future agendas

	It was noted that a recent episode of the Countrywide TV programme had reported that 74% of	
	residents in rural areas are dissatisfied with the local policing and that rural crime should be a major

597	A) Update on Positon regarding Steering Group Comments It was stressed that the Parish Council did not want to lose the enthusiasm and commitment from people on the Steering Group and Cllr Dickson suggested that a Working Group get together to reevaluate the Parish Council's approach to Neighbourhood Planning. Cllr Dickson would lead this with the aim of reporting back at the November GPC Meeting on how the Neighbourhood Plan would be progressed. A member of the Steering Group noted in the public session that it may be difficult for the Steering Group to regroup if the communication from the GPC broke down in a formal sense. It was noted that the Neighbourhood Plan was important and Cllr Dickson would send a note around to the Group at the end of August.	RD
598	Allotments a) Update from Allotment Working Party Cllr Lloyd updated the meeting. A site meeting had been held with Nick Edge to review the position and to help speed up the timescale for allocation of allotments. At this meeting responsibility for maintenance of the allotments and surrounding areas had been discussed. The Community Orchard was the responsibility of the Parish Council and there was a need to identify a contractor to carry out this work and on other communal areas which were not the responsibility of the allotment holders or WM Housing. Cllr Ashton Jones had advertised the allotments in Fownhope and in Bartestree and Lugwardine. Currently there were 9 people who had shown interest in the 13 allotments.	
	b) To Approve the Tenancy Agreement Draft 2 of the Allotment Tenancy Agreement had been circulated for comments. It was proposed that the cost would be £1 per week for small/medium allotments and £2 per week for large plots. Sections on sheds and insurance needed to be added and the start date for the lease incorporated once this was agreed. Cllr Lloyd explained that the outline costs for water was based on the Leominster model but a review would be built in so that adjustments could be made once actual costs were known. 599	a) To Consider Request to plant Memorial Tree Christine Evans had asked for permission to plant a tree in the Burial Ground in memory of Roger Willott. A mulberry tree had been suggested and possibly some spring bulbs later in the year. It was felt that this would be acceptable in principle but that a meeting was needed to discuss location and the type/size of tree. Cllr Dickson agreed to arrange a meeting with Cllr Ashton Jones, Cllr Jones and Christine Evans. b) To Consider Work to Memorials in Closed Churchyard In 2013 a quotation was requested from Arthur J Virgo to undertake work on some memorials in the closed Churchyard. This work had not yet been done and the Clerk had obtained an up to date quotation which was £412. The Clerk was concerned that undertaking this work did not set a precedent which may be costly in the future. Cllr Hardwick confirmed that if the Parish Council had been asked to take on responsibility for the Closed Churchyard it could not refuse this. It was felt that more information was required before this expenditure was approved and the Clerk was asked to request this from Brian Dukes.
